- ◆ Must be 8x10 size or 16x20 and use a white or cream matte.
- ◆ Color or black and white photos are accepted. Must be framed by the artist and wired and ready for hanging.
- ◆ We will accept 2 pieces per artist.
- ◆ We will have a separate category for student art submissions, (high school and one for college students).
- ◆ The exhibit will be juried and prizes will be awarded.
- ◆ Your photos may also be used for future brochures and materials with credit given to the photographer.
